Recycling-oriented agriculture

Mulberries trim their branches during the winter so that new branches sprout the following spring. Some of the branches are used for tea, and the rest are made into chips and laid at the base of the mulberry to prevent weeds. The chips decompose over 5 to 10 years to grow fluffy soil.



The management area is about 10 hectares. It has become the largest cultivation of medicinal plants in the region. Starting with "mulberry", we have succeeded in a stable supply of "Asaba", which is said to be difficult to cultivate. In addition, we are also working on the cultivation of about 10 types of plants, such as "moringa", "mugwort".
